

AARAMBH Nurturing identity of the young Tribal Girls at Jhabua and Alirajpur District of MP

Tribal girls are making significant strides in education and life skills, breaking barriers and achieving excellence. AARAMBH's efforts in Jhabua and Bhabra Block of Alirajpur Districts in Madhya Pradesh have helped over 196 tribal girls gain access to education, with a notable increase in girls transitioning to secondary schools to higher education through our sponsorship project with the support of ChildFund International. Our education support provides safe learning spaces and emphasizes the importance of education, addressing cultural norms that often limit girls' potential.

Our Udan fellowship programme have also been instrumental in creating an enabling environment for girls to access quality education. These initiatives focus on community involvement, promoting gender equality, and ensuring that education respects indigenous knowledge systems and promotes inclusivity.

The journey of tribal girls is a testament to their resilience and determination, as they navigate challenges and work towards a brighter future. Their achievements in education and life skills are a reflection of their strength and the support they receive from various initiatives and community efforts. All 196 young tribal girls are now shining and set an example for remote villages tribal girls.
