Introduction

AARAMBH Organization has been continuously working in 14 villages of Sonkatch and Hatpipliya blocks of Dewas district under the program of Child Protection and Family Empowerment. The organization is especially working with highly vulnerable and marginalized families, particularly the Nihal community.

The main objective of the organization is to reduce child labour, ensure regular school attendance of children, prevent child marriage, and increase awareness regarding education in the community. Earlier, many children from the Nihal community had never attended school. However, through continuous efforts such as family counselling, community meetings, school coordination, educational support, and regular follow-up, these children are now regularly attending school, appearing in board examinations and passing with good marks.

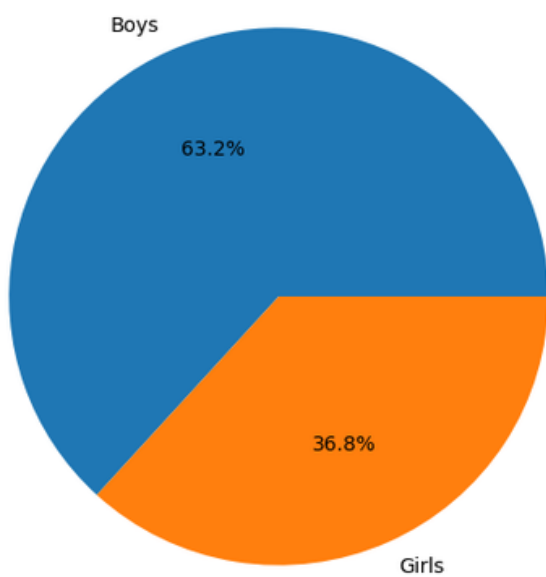
Many families in the community were facing challenges such as poverty, migration, lack of awareness towards education, and non-availability of essential documents including Birth Certificates, Samagra ID, and Aadhaar Cards, which often prevented children from enrolling in schools. To address these issues, AARAMBH has been consistently supporting children through KITE Centres, child-friendly learning practices, behavioural change activities, and close coordination with schools and Panchayats. These efforts have helped children continue their education and develop confidence towards a better future.

Recently, the children supported under the program successfully appeared in the MP Board Examinations, where out of 67 children who appeared in Class 5 Board Examination, 63 children passed with very good percentage, and out of 29 children who appeared in Class 8 Board Examination, 24 children passed with good marks. This achievement reflects a positive transformation within the community and is a matter of pride for both the organization and the families.

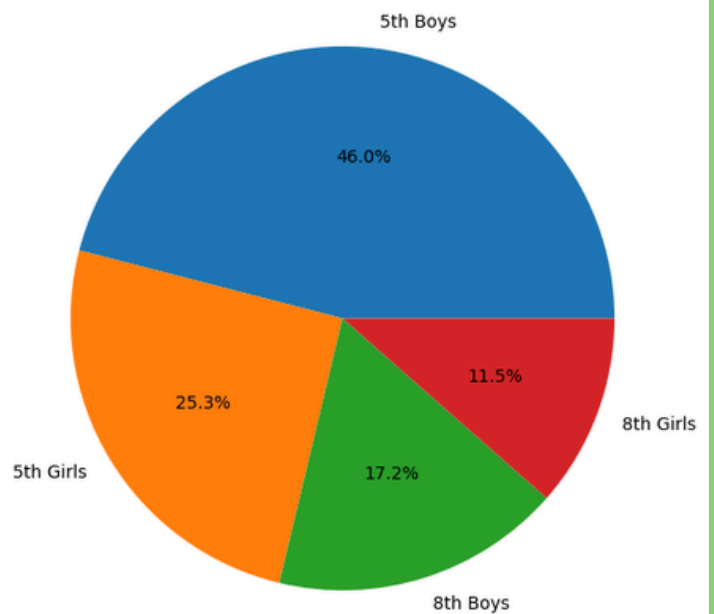
OVERALL EXAMINATION OUTCOME (2025-26)

- Support was provided for obtaining essential documents and linking families with government welfare schemes.
